# Tropical Cyclone Donna Response

## Torres Islands, Vanuatu

July 2017

TC Donna passed 50-100km north of the Torres islands in Torba Province as a category 3 cyclone on the 4th & 5th of May 2017. Destructive winds and heavy rain caused significant damage. This graphic summarises the Government of Vanuatu's response. Many partner agencies supported the response.



### PHASE 1

Weeks 1-2



Simultaneous deployment of assessment teams and initial relief supplies within 72 hours of the system passing out of the Vanuatu region.

Aerial surveillance of northern provinces. Aerial transport of assessment teams from Port Vila. An onsite coordination hub is established in Loh for local planning and distribution.

### PHASE 2

Weeks 3-8



Consolidated delivery of major relief supplies based on initial assessments. Sectoral specialists deploy for detailed assessments.

Multiple cargo trips deliver relief supplies to the Torres Islands during May and June 2017. Vessels that left from Port Vila include: La Glorieuise; RVS Tukoro; the LC Kiwi Trader; Pacific Hope; and MV Southern Cross.

Local authorities with support from the NDMO and Red Cross coordinate the distribution of supplies by boat to the islands. Response phase ended in July 2017.

### RECOVERY

Ongoing



The main focus of the recovery program will be education, health, WASH and agriculture.

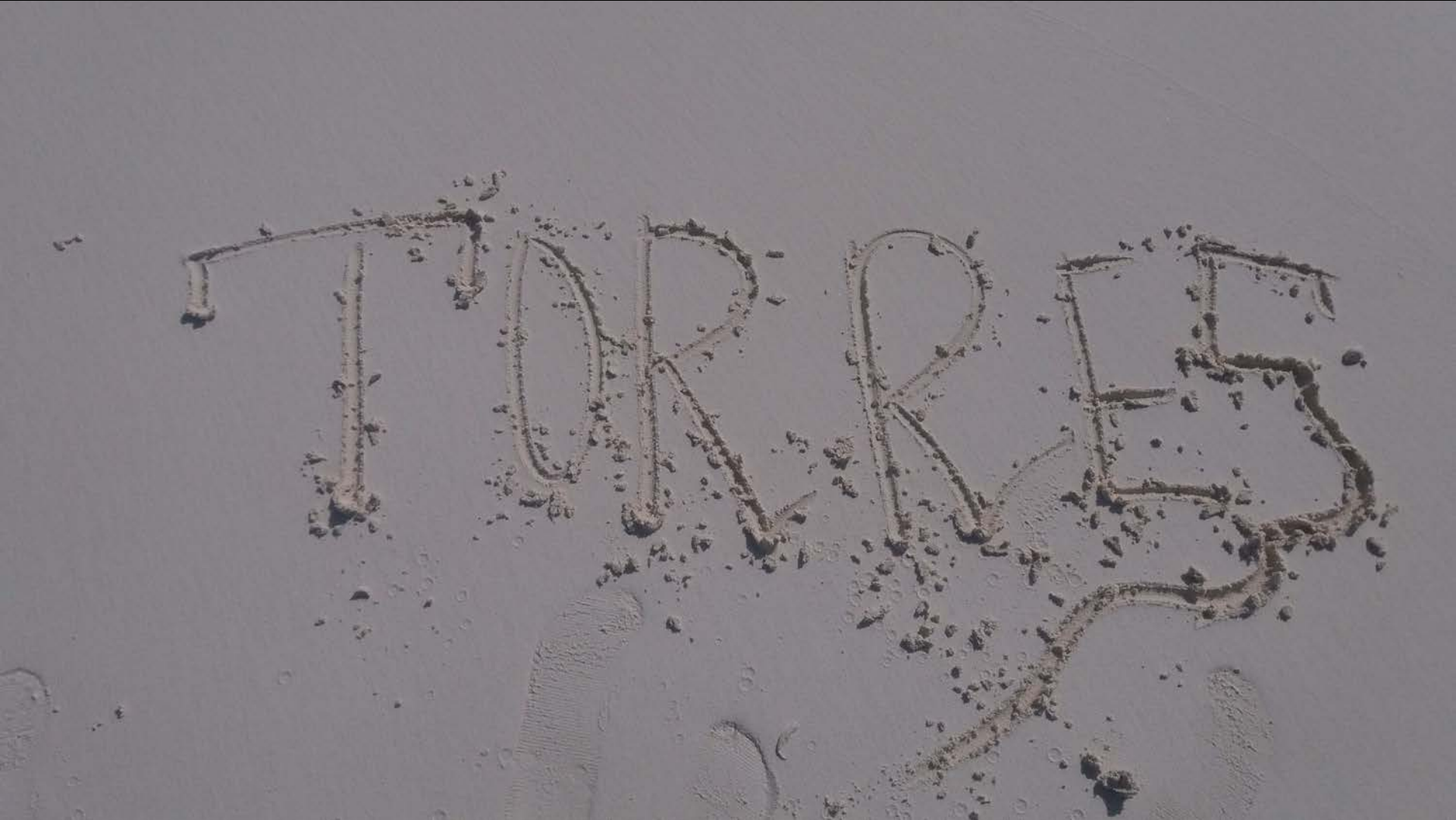
