

## Background

Tropical Cyclone HOLA have sweep through Penama ,Malampa ,Sanma ,Shefa and Tafea on the 5<sup>th</sup> Of march to  $10^{th}$  of march 2018. The effects of the system have caused several damages to crops, vegetation, roads and buildings. (See below the Tracking Map of the system, source VMGD)




## Findings from the Aerial Surveillance

The assessment team notice that the impacts from tropical cyclone Hola towards surveyed islands are not the same. The severity of the winds, rain and flooding is diverse in all the islands surveyed.

The team then prioritize the areas base on the scale of damages on different sectors. Refer below is the maps showing the most affected and priority areas.
