Situation Overview

The main impacts from TC Cook are in Malampa, Shefa and Penma provinces. The National Disaster Committee (NDC) met on Tuesday 11th April 2017 and approved a detailed multi-sector assessment including Food Security and Agriculture, WASH and infrastructure to determine the extent and severity of impacts from the Cyclone. Sector specialists will conduct the on ground assessments. The NDMO continues to remotely gather information and collate reports from partner agencies already on the ground in the provinces.

There is a single NDMO supported evacuation centre remaining open as of today. From Thursday 13th April all NDMO support evacuation centres will be closed.

The National Disaster Management Office is working with line ministries and partner agencies to coordinate the response. The Government of Vanuatu is using the Emergency Fund support assessments and operations.

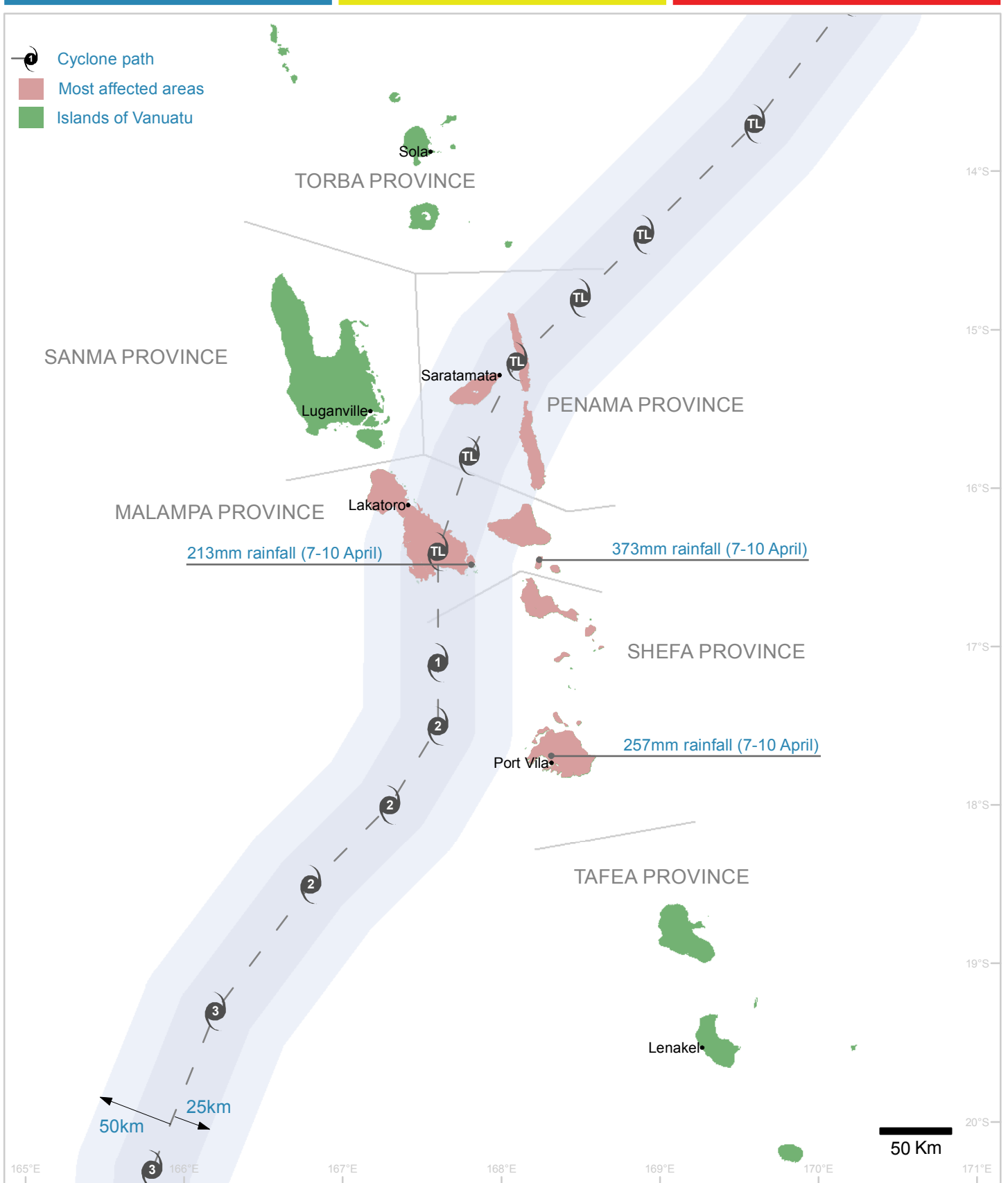
Cyclone path and most affected areas
