<p>Agenda 2 & 3 Feedback on Guidance Note for Partner Agencies (NDMO)</p> <p>and</p> <p>Feedback on key messages for the community (NDMO)</p>	<p>Discussions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Most cluster members are happy with the overall Guidance Notes - DFAT(Jed Abad) requested clarity on the support the Gov will provide after the 30th of July 2018 for population outside the evacuation centres - Chairperson: current response is on-going for both the evacuation centres and the affected communities. This support will continue until the 1st of June.Post 1st of June the emergency funding will move out of Ambae and only focus on Maewo island. - Education: What will happen to community who will remain on Ambae Island? Need to ensure there is a bottom-up approach for proper assessments to provide continuity of services after the 30th of July. Few schools on Ambae have currently started term 2 on the island. - Chairperson: A clear balance needs to be establish between the community and the Government concerning the education service delivery on Ambae. - WASH: Water is safe on Ambae from the two safe water bow holes and the rainwater harvesting. Continuous rainfall on Ambae. Calling off water trucking team this week from Ambae due to shortage of funding. There is existing water tanks in the community where people can access water if the water trucking team retreats next week. Recommend awareness team to go out in the field with the key messages in hand. Suggesting another guidance note for implementing agencies outlining what is the role of clusters when relocation happens on Maewo Island. - Georgia Tacey (Education cluster): Request/suggest clusters to

come up with specific Q&A on information specific to the relocation on Maewo.

- Robert Dodds (shelter cluster): No specific answers for the community. It is not an emergency, people will have different need as they move into a 'second home'.
- Education: Request to include (reference) Santo and Pentecost because some secondary schools are relocated into these two islands.
- Chairperson: A specific set of key messages for education is needed in this case (previously raised by Education cluster). Ms. Virana Lini will be working with NDMO on the specific key messages for Education.
- Translation of the key messages is underway to have the key messages in Bislama.
- Wash Coordinator: Requests Guidance Note to be specific whether its 'host community' or the 'permanent relocation sites'?
- Chairperson: It will be clearly added in the Guidance Note
- DFAT: Requests shelter status of the people who will be relocated to Maewo?
- Shelter cluster: There is a need to consult with communities on how they want to engage in this whole operation. It is not an emergency evacuation. People will be relocated into a different island as a second home. Planning needs to be done. Emergency camps like last year is not going to be used here
- Chairperson: A rephrase of the sentence in the guidance note/key messages concerning shelter is needed
- Education: Will there be a formal consultation between the province and the community? Shelter 'entitlements' is a matter that needs to be discussed between the province and the communities
- Chairperson: Province is tasked to do some ground work on who is willing to relocate to Maewo Island. Identified people to relocate are the ones which whom the province will have a consultation with them.
- WASH Coordinator: Raising expectation (Expectation management) for communities is not a way forward. We need to look at how prepare are we with the plannings of this whole operation. Are the resources available to receive the evacuees on Maewo? We need to be carefully well delivering these well written

<p>Agenda 4 Ambae relocation tasks and next steps (NDMO)</p>	<p>Ops Manager - <i>Looking into the table outlining 'tasks and next steps'</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Activity, responsibility and timeline (table) - Following activities more or less addressed the 3 different scenarios (AOB point) - Timeline to help our planning (guidance) - Allocation of these tasking is focused on moving people off island to Maewo on voluntary basis (scenario 2). It does not cover any activity for scenario 1 where 'no one moves/relocates to Maewo' - Education: Request date for 'preparation to move' to come forward (14th May and on-going) - Education has already moved school furniture last week - Chairperson: Relocation of people into Maewo will be stages starting from the land on north Maewo (Loloruku permanent site). The Permanent Relocation Task Force (PRTF) is looking on everything that covers the allocation of the 4 sites on Maewo and the land compensation to the land owners. These issues will not be discussed in the inter-cluster meetings. Scenario 1 is at the discretion of the Permanent Relocation Task Force - Greg: Cautious of the number of tasks that are outside the control of the NDMO and agencies in the room. Further that the complexity and uncertainty regarding some aspects of the operation mean that the proposed timeline should be used as a guide only. - Ops Manager: Land will be owned by the government. More information needs to be given by the PRTF before any further comments on the question of land ownership - WASH: Evacuation is delayed as stated in this timeline of activities. Any feedbacks on the Flash Appeal? - Education (Georgia Tacey): Do you envisage 30th July everything (operation) is complete? - Chairperson: State of Emergency (SoE) lapse on 13th July. 	

	<p>Government assistance on relocation begins on 1st June until 30th July. Our response will end on 30th of July (the Emergency response - Government assistance). However, dry ration will continue on Maewo for another 6 months. It looks like the emergency response will be extended for another 6 months (awaiting another COM decision for this)</p>

<p>Agenda 4 Cluster updates</p>	<p>Discussions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - G&P - Current team on ground plus the Save the children on-ground team - Child friendly space created in each EC (10 communities). The rising level of 'black magic' stories by adults on Maewo distressing children on the EC. Psycho-social needs for children is also taken into consideration - Key messages very helpful and clearly written to support the awareness group going out into the communities and the EC - No activity on Maewo yet - SitRep 16 has some key recommendations from the G&P clusters for other clusters to consider - Consider the G&P issues on-ground - <hr/> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - WASH - Water trucking more than 80,000 L of water to EC since Day 1 until today - VIP toilets and pit latrine distributed - No diarrhea outbreaks in EC since Day 1 - Currently water is safe for drinking - Response on AMbae is slowly scaled down. Ground team will be sent back to their base in the coming days and week - Hygiene kits sent to Maewo along with water tanks (19) and cater on Narovorovo and Kerebay. - Sanitation facility in place - Nandiutu School been given a water tank and water refill into the new tank - Aore SDA College a tank as well as Bombua school - Gambule School will also have a tank - 31st May will a WASH team (7 officers) to be deployed to Maewo for 1 month period (30th June) <hr/> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Health - no representative <hr/> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Education - Penama PEO is working closely with the other Heads of 	

department to deliver awareness to the communities on the COMS decision for volunteer movement

- St Patrick's College started school in Santo East.
- Academic programs have commenced in temporary shelters erected by Santo East - at their own cost
- Boys sleeping in a Fare within Shapi Stadium and Girls at year 4 and 5 classrooms
- Principal and few teachers are housed at Nambanga Guest house while some others are with their relatives - Questions raised as to who will be responsible for rent payment
- Penama Adventist Students and teachers are well hosted in Aore Adventist Academy (Aore AA)
- Tagaga College to move to Melsisi College
- These are registered school and review on the legislation is needed.
- Some schools are still sitting 'on the fence' and left undecided.
- Continuous collaboration with other cluster during disaster period
- Developing a COM paper on the cost of relocation on the new sites. New classrooms are needed in the long term, thus, a long term strategy will be developed.
- Education subsidy will be given to students who permanently live on Ambae. It will cover for term 2 and 3 of 2018 and hopefully for the whole 2019 as well. Instructions as been given to schools not to send students away for late school fee payment. School grants will be disbursed in June 2018. Student relocated to other schools not in the list of schools of the education cluster are requested to notify the respective Education PEO
