#### **Situation Overview**

- A State of Emergency is in place on the island of Ambae until the 26th September 2018.
- The Vanuatu Meteorology and GeoHazard Department has the Ambae Volcano at Alert Level 3.
- A full, compulsory evacuation of the island of Ambae has been completed.
- The population who have relocated to Maewo continue to settle into host communities. Regular coordination meetings taking place in Kerebei and clusters are supporting the provision of services in host communities. A smaller emergency operations centre is also active in Narovorovo
- A number of issues have been raised by evacuees on Maewo including: access to a balanced diet; having appropriate accommodation; females and children having access to suitable toilet and shower facilities; and the loss of income. These issues are being raised and managed through the onsite operations centre.
- The Sanma Provincial Emergency Operations Centre has been officially activated today. It will coordinate the management of those with special needs in Luganville.
- Ambae residents with special needs were transferred to Luganville on the 8<sup>th</sup> August 2018. These people largely remain at the wharf, however, due to the unsuitable conditions some have moved away with carers and into host communities. Suitable longer term accommodation has not yet been found. Additional people with special needs are coming to the facility at the wharf.
- The Ambae community on Santo has been informally registering voluntary movements of people.
   It is expected that this information will form the basis of future comprehensive displacement tracking.
- The Vanuatu National Provident Fund (VNPF) Board has opened up a partial (20%) withdrawal to affected Ambaeans who are members of VNPF as of 13<sup>th</sup> August 2018. The initiative is also opened to other members who have relationship or in a relationship with an Ambaean whose family are affected by the emergency.

#### **General Coordination**

- The onsite emergency operations centrer (EOC) in Kerebei is the primary coordination hub for evacuations to Maewo. Daily coordination meetings are held each morning.
- A Permanent Relocation Taskforce meeting was held in Port Vila on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> August 2018 to further consider long-term relocation options. The Relocation Technical Working Group will meet next week.
- It is expected that that the Council of Ministers will meet next week and discussion will include consideration of both the next steps in the response operation and the long term relocation.

### **Displacement Figures**

- All evacuations from Ambae are complete.
- Some of those that have relocated are still moving on ground as part of the relocation process. The onsite operations centre in Kerebei is responsible for the registration process on Maewo. On Santo, the Ambae community has undertaken an informal registration process.
- The Education Cluster estimates that at least 250 children of ECCE age and 550 children of primary age have arrived in Maewo. A further 350 children of ECCE age and 1,650 children of primary age have arrived in Santo. The cluster is currently verifying these estimates.

### MAEWO ONSITE EOC UPDATE | 14th - 17th August 2018 | 2:00pm

#### **General Update**

Ambae evacuation off-island is completed as of Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> August 2017. Internal movement on Maewo from transit evacuation centres (EC) to host communities (HC) is still ongoing. The Maewo onsite EOC aims to complete the movements by end of next week (end of school break).

Evacuees' population data is estimated at **2,631** with a total number of **746 households**. The number will change once internal movements and registration is complete.

A Maewo chief's representative meeting was held at Nakoro (Rasa Ulumanu's Nakamal) where Government cluster leads were requested to attend. This meeting was an avenue for Maewo chief's representative to understand each clusters priority and how they can support at their level. Chiefs also mentioned the permanent relocation land plots (Loloruku, Naruru and Sanasom) and assured the Government cluster leads that on-going consultation with customary land owners is currently underway. In the interest of planning, Maewo Chiefs gave until 16<sup>th</sup> September 2018 (Penama Day) as the cutoff date for planning purposes.

Respective clusters continue to provide humanitarian assistance to evacuees in specific host communities.

#### **Cluster Update**

#### **FSAC**

As of 16<sup>th</sup> August 2018, 1,379 bags of rice along with 1,311 cartons of tin fish have been distributed to host communities from north to south Maewo.

#### WASH

On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> August the 1<sup>st</sup> joint coordination meeting between Wash, health and other partners took place in Naone village to discuss planning in the response. For planning purposes, Maewo Island was divided into 3 zones (1. Asanvari to Talise; 2. Navenvene to Naone; 3. Naone to Naumumu) to enable a more focused response in each host communities under each zone. Wash hygiene kits continued to be distributed in host communities accessible by land transport as well as host communities that require sea transportation to have access to (transportation of hygiene kits by boat as road is too bumpy). A diarrhea case is reported in Nasawa, however this case is brought from Ambae; potable water on Maewo are safe to drink and to this date, no diarrhea outbreak has been reported on Maewo island. Ongoing vip toilet slabs construction is happening in many host communities along with volunteers training being provided on how to construct these vip toilet slabs.

#### **HEALTH**

Health mobile clinics continue to visit host communities in providing general basic health services to Ambae evacuees and Maewo community people altogether. A cluster team was sent to Ambae (Lolowai hospital) to get left furniture's that will be used in sub-health centres in north and south Maewo. As of Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> August 2018, health cluster is working in joint collaboration with Wash cluster. There are on-going negotiations at this stage to upgrade the power supply of Kerembei health centre to enable proper power supply to the number of services the health cluster in now addressing.

#### **EDUCATION**

The education cluster has taken most of this week conducting assessment trying to find the exact number of primary school children in host communities and at the same time assessment for location of new schools and toilet locations in specific host communities.

#### **LOGISTICS**

Lack of vehicle is a challenge for the overall operation when a cluster needs to be deployed in the field. The mobile Storage Unit (MSU) has been set-up and dry ration is being removed from Gambule school storage into it. More relief items are expected to be removed from the temporary storage facility to be stored in the MSU for proper stock release monitoring.

#### **GENDER & PROTECTION**

The G&P cluster lead has been conducting focused group with evacuees in each host communities to collect the different challenges and issues faced by the evacuees and later to be discussed with other cluster on how to address these challenges and issues.

Save the Children as cluster co-lead continues to provide assistance through setting up of 7 complete Child Friendly Space (CFS) and Psychosocial Support (PSS). Local volunteers from both Ambae and Maewo are being contracted to work alongside the cluster in providing continuous CFS and PSS services to evacuees in host communities and in finalizing CFS registration.

### **Education Cluster Situation Report**

Incident/Event: Ambae Volcano

#### Situation overview

- As a result of the volcanic activity on Ambae and the decision to evacuate all residents, around 3,000 evacuees arrived in Maewo. The Education Cluster estimates that 250 children of ECCE age and 550 children of primary age have arrived in Maewo. It is estimated that 350 children of ECCE age and 1,650 children of primary age arrived in Santo. The Education Cluster is currently implementing an assessment to verify these estimates.
- Due to the limited number of ECCE (17) and primary schools (7) in host communities in Maewo, the existing schools will not be able to accommodate all children relocated from Ambae.
- Schools are currently closed, but will reopen on 27. August 2018.

### **Education Cluster response**

- A team of eight Ministry of Education and Training (MoET) staff arrived on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> August 2018 to join three Provincial Education Officers to assess education needs and coordinate the education response for the coming two weeks before classes resume on the 27<sup>th</sup> of August 2018.
- Education Cluster Emergency Operation Centre (EOC) was set up in Gambule School.
- Education Cluster had its first meeting on the 11<sup>th</sup> of August 2018 for the provincial education staff to discuss the education situation and way forward. The MoET team finalized and submitted its 3-month budget and implementation plan.
- The Education Assessment commenced on 14<sup>th</sup> of August 2018 and the team completed the assessment of three Ambae communities. The MoET team registered 30 ECCE children, 48 primary students and two secondary students. The MoET team was able to identify only a single ECCE teacher and no primary or secondary teacher.
- UNICEF provided six 42m<sup>2</sup> tents, which arrived in Maewo. Additional 12 tents are waiting to be shipped from Port Vila and 7 tents are on the way to Santo.
- The WASH Cluster agreed to support in WASH response in schools.

• Initial assessment findings indicate a serious lack of teachers among evacuated Ambae communities. In the three assessed communities only a single ECCE teacher was present.

### **Constraints**

- Limited access to network and internet makes communication difficult.
- Slow movement of Ambae communities to host Maewo community delays our Education Assessment and education response planning.
