#### **Situation Overview**

- A State of Emergency is in place on the island of Ambae until the 26th September 2018.
- The Vanuatu Meteorology and GeoHazard Department has the Ambae Volcano at Alert Level 3.
- A full, compulsory evacuation of the island of Ambae has been completed.
- The populations who have relocated to Maewo have now settled into host communities and host families. Registration of evacuees is expected to be completed by next week.
- Maewo Emergency Operations Center is aware of the number of issues raised by Maewo Evacuees and is coordinating clusters and humanitarian partners response activities on ground and are working on supporting the provision of services in the host communities.
- Telecom Vanuatu Limited (TVL) through the Emergency Tele-communications Cluster has provided better internet links for the Maewo main operational hub to ensure effective information exchange though internet. Further to that TVL is working on upgrading its telecommunications services in Maewo, while Digicel is working on building a new tower in Maewo.
- The National Bank of Vanuatu has increased its service by operating 5 days a week, commencing this week.
- The FRANZ partners travelled to Maewo on the 21<sup>st</sup> of August 2018. The purpose of the trip was to do site visits to host communities and to meet with the Maewo EOC team to get an overview of how their assistance has contributed to the livelihood of the evacuees and to identify the gaps that still needs to be addressed.
- The Sanma Provincial Emergency Operation Center is working closely with the Gender & Protection and the Health cluster to support the evacuees with special needs.
- Humanitarian partners on-ground include World Food Program (WFP), Unicef, Save the Children, ADRA and Care International

#### **General Coordination**

- The onsite emergency operations center (EOC) in Kerembei is the primary coordination hub for evacuations to Maewo. Daily coordination meetings are held each morning.
- Another smaller emergency operation center is also active in Narovorovo to support host communities in the South.
- The Sanma Provincial Emergency Operation Center has been coordinating the response to those with special needs in Luganville. Daily coordination meetings are held each morning.
- The NDMO Media and Communications officer participated in a Radio Vanuatu Tok Bak Show program today 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2018, to clarify and discuss issues related to the Ambae Evacuees on Maewo

#### **Displacement Figures**

- All evacuations from Ambae are complete.
- Registration for Maewo Evacuees is still ongoing. A confirmed figure will be published once the registration is finalized.
- Between 28<sup>th</sup> July and 12<sup>th</sup> August 2018, the Maritime movements recorded 4,250 people moving from Ambae to Santo. The Ambae Community in Santo have also undertaken a registration of voluntary movement of all Ambae people including those who have moved last year 2017 and they estimated that approximately 6,000 Ambaean are in Santo.

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### MAEWO ONSITE EOC UPDATE 03 | 18<sup>th</sup> - 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2018 | 13:20pm

#### **General Update**

A FRANZ Partner delegation made a day visit to Maewo on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> August 2018 to have a glance of the on-ground operation coordination. Upon their arrival, the delegation made a quick stopover at Naumumu village (north Maewo) to see or themselves an example of host community where evacuees at hosted at. The delegation made its way to Kerepei where the onsite EOC hub is located for a proper welcome by the Maewo high chief – Rasa Ure (Mr. Elison Reveala), who is also the Maewo island chiefs' representative along with the NDMO Director and other Government and NGO representatives.

Rasa Ure welcomed and acknowledged the FRANZ Partner's presence on Maewo, along with their continuous financial and technical support since the beginning of the current response until today. Rasa Ure reassured the delegation on the on-going working collaboration between the them, the National Government and the Maewo community in making sure Ambae evacuees feel at home will being hosted by Maewo host communitites.

The delegation made a visit to south Maewo in the afternoon to see the Narovorovo host community. While in Narovorovo, the Penama Province President took the opportunity to acknowledge the ongoing support from FRANZ Partners in providing relief items in cash and in kind, and also reassured the delegation of the continuous working relationship FRANZ Partners has with the Penama Provincial Government.

The delegation made a brief stop at Marino host community (north Maewo) before heading back to the airport to depart for Port Vila, later in the evening.

Ambae evacuee's registration on Maewo is estimated at 2,600+ as of Tuesday 21 August while the finalization of data is currently underway and should be finalized by the end of this week.

Cluster leads representatives and their co-leads continue to provide humanitarian assistance to Ambae evacuees and supporting the Maewo host communities.

#### **Cluster Update**

#### **FSAC**

As of Wednesday 22nd August 2018, there are 81 bags of rice (excluding 1 damaged bag of rice) and 90 cartons of tin fish from the 1<sup>st</sup> food push in the Kerepei Mobile Storage Unit (MSU). 1<sup>st</sup> food push of local food was sourced from Boskole, Nasawa and Baitora villages and re-distributed to Nasawa and Narovorovo host communities along with Sulua School and Gambule School transit evacuation centre (9 August). FSAC local food stock survey revealed that host communities 'private' stock of local food will only last a month and a half if they continue to supply for both themselves and the evacuees. FSAC highly recommends that additional local produce and vegetable be sourced from outer islands. Host communities are encouraged to support evacuees with local food supply.

Dry seeds distribution began on Monday 20 August in Ngota, boskole, Sanasom and Wihil host communities since evacuees in these communities are living in individual household. Dry seeds distribution also happened on south Maewo Narovorovo and Nasawa.

A support officer from the FSAC regional cluster was deployed to Maewo on Saturday 18 August to support the cluster ground operation and at the same time conduct a needs assessment in all host communities.

#### WASH

Wash cluster continues to construct VIP toilet slabs and toilet raiser for host communities with consideration and priority being placed for people with disability

(pwd) and elderly people. Hand washing buckets and sanitary soap along with TP taps are deing distributed in each host communities.

ADRA is been given the whole zone 1 to make quick fix on water systems and to build temporary bathing facility in all host communities. ADRA will also be shipping the water system supply material this week

Red Cross continues to deliver hygiene promotion messages to host communities in south and north Maewo.

#### **HEALTH**

Health cluster continues to provide support via their mobile clinic/outreach team in host communities in both north and south Maewo. Distribution of Family Hygien Kits (FHK) and mother-infant kits is on-going as cluster team reached host communities.

No diarrhea outbreak reported on host communities as described by a social media (Facebook) post in the past 24-48 hours. While right to information remains crucial in an operation, the health cluster is kindly requesting any individual and organization to get accurate information from each cluster before wider dissemination.

The Vanuatu Family Health (VFH) team will return to Port Vila tomorrow Thursday 23 August after a successful health service delivery support to the cluster lead to host communities in the past couple of weeks.

#### **EDUCATION**

The Education cluster has completed all the cluster assessments to collect exact number of primary school students and the locations of potential schools to be built on targeted host communities. There are 500+ primary school students and another 300+ ECCE students. 10 identified sites have been selected as to where primary schools be built at. Additional tents to be used as temporary classroom are currently in Port Vila awaiting the next logistical shipment Port Vila – Maewo to be sent to Maewo; possibility is that these tents will be sent to Maewo via MV Kalyara.

Education cluster has been using the VMF officers as 'man-power' to gather local material for temporary classroom construction in preparation for term 3 to begin.

As of today, 3 tents have already been uplifted in 3 identified sites while 3 more tents are still waiting to be uplifted in the coming days.

#### **LOGISTICS**

Agreed fuel for contracted vehicle used in this operation has been cut down from 20L to 15L per day. Managing contracted vehicle remains a logistical challenge due to other 'private' runnings. MV Kalyara on its way from Santo to Vila brought additional drum fuel to support the on-going operation. MV Kalyara and LC Mahalia are currently in Port Vila with a possibility for Kalyara to depart Port Vila tonight. One of these two sea vessels will be used for the shipment of the 2<sup>nd</sup> dry ration food push from Port Vila to Maewo along with the Education tents. 2<sup>nd</sup> food push loading in Port Vila is currently being disturbed due to bad weather. A law enforcement officer has been requested to be posted full time at the MSU to control daily relief items release supported by the NDMO logistic person on-ground with the use of MSU release form. Rasa Ulumanu (Freddy Wilson) has been contracted to supply firewood to host communities who are still cooking together (bulk cooking), while options are still being considered on how fire wood can be provided to host communities on south Maewo.

#### GENDER & PROTECTION (G&P)

The Gender & Protection cluster remains a cross-cutting cluster and other clusters are being advised to ensure their teams are G&P inclusive. Finalization of disaggregated for pwd in specific host communities

is on-going as cluster members make their way into each host communities. Santo evacuation center reported a casualty (elderly woman) which occurred in the past 72 hours.

The FRANZ Partner delegation visit was an opportunity for the G&P cluster to highlight some of the challenges raised in host communities for pwd and elderly people. The cluster is urgently requesting a more balanced diet for evacuees as well as concerns over potable water in host communities. The cluster continues to emphasize for WASH cluster to prioritize VIP toilets for pwd and elderly people first.


#### INTRODUCTORY INFORMATION

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- WATER Is safe on Maewo for consumption
- Water system assessment of host communities;
- Detailed water systems assessment at relocation sites
- Distribution of hygiene kits
- Construction of VIP Latrines

### A. CONTEXT

The WASH Cluster, through its coordinator have been deployed and have established a team in Maewo, who consists of water, sanitation and hygiene technical personnel. The main task of the team is to support WASH activities in parallel to national efforts through the National EOC established in Kerebei to both the existing population in Maewo and the evacuees from Ambae.

Hygiene kits and households WASH items continue being distributed while water system assessments of host communities are completed. Two of the four relocation sites have been assessed and a report is being prepared to determine the suitability of the sites to cater for the WASH needs of the relocated population. The remaining two sites will be completed in the coming weeks.

A strengthened coordination team is now on the ground with inter- cluster meeting being conducted on a nightly basis with the health cluster as well as members of the protection and education clusters.

#### B. AFFECTED POPULATION/NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Although 16 communities have been assessed as adequate to cater for the WASH needs of relocated populations, evacuees are still are being relocated by the National EOC, while some are choosing to move on their own due to familial ties or religious affiliations. This

continuous movement of people has made it difficult to plan WASH cluster activities, also due to the poor reporting of movement back to the National EOC.

The Cluster on agreement with partners, have categorized the island in to three zones:

- 1. Zone 1 (South) Talise to Boscole
- 2. Zone 2 (Central) Navenvene to Naone
- 3. Zone 3 (North) Taqwalava to Naumumu

The WASH cluster has requested the Red Cross to conduct a quick survey of the population, taking into consideration both existing and relocated populations in order to support planning and interventions. Below is a table with current estimated population by community (updated 16th August 2018):

### C. PROGRAMMING

WASH activities are ongoing with water system assessments being completed for all host communities. The assessment teams have put together BOQ's for all communities. Assessment of schools and health facilities will be completed next week and forwarded to the relevant clusters for necessary actions.

Detailed water system assessment has been completed for 2 of the 4 relocation sites, namely, Loloruku and Naruru.

Hygiene kit distribution is nearing completion with a total of 407 households reached. Due to the continuous movement of evacuees, monitoring is being conducted in order to leave no one behind, and continues to be a difficulty with the probability of duplication increasing as movements are not reported.

VIP latrine slab and riser production has begun with 4 communities completed with the remaining communities to be completed within the next 2 weeks. Communities are being engaged to provide labor as well as conduct site identification and pit digging as the slabs and riser are awaiting solidification. The Vanuatu Military Force has also been requested to support communities in pit digging as the island terrain make it's difficult to dig more than 2m. Subs-surface is very rocky for inland communities and very sandy for communities close to the sea.

ADRA has agreed to support 8 host communities (Nasawa, Norovorovo, Kerebei, Naone, Betaratara, Rongnawo, Ngota and Naviso) on:

- 1. Upgrade of existing water systems
- 2. Installation of rain water harvesting systems
- 3. Installation of VIP latrines
- 4. Installation of hand washing facilities
- 5. Installation of bathing facilities (all host communities)
- 6. Hygiene promotion

The cluster has is also working closely with the Health Cluster as well as save the children and Red Cross Vanuatu to coordinate WASH activities, share resources and minimize duplication.

Nightly meetings are being undertaken for planning and joint interventions by the mentioned partners. The partners have also agreed on key WASH messages that will be used for the response.

WASH activities are coordinated with the National EOC in Kerebei and according to the cluster Response plan. Its main focus is now the assessment of host communities, distribution of hygiene kits as well as the construction of VIP latrines.

Hygiene promotion has begun with a training of volunteers conducted in partnership with the Health Cluster and involved personnel from Save the Children, Family Health and Red Cross Vanuatu. These volunteers will be tasked to conducted hygiene awareness in all communities as part of ongoing partner activities. The WASH Cluster has also conducted hygiene promotion sessions when in communities with a total of 172 households reached. This has been incorporated into planned daily activities and will be ongoing throughout the response.

#### D. PARTNERSHIP AND COORDINATION

The WASH cluster team members continue to participate in the daily brief and de-brief with the National EOC in Kerebei as well as the partnership meeting on a daily basis.

- 7. Save the Children
  - a. Hygiene promotion on child friendly spaces (CFSs)
  - b. Installation of tippy taps in CFSs as well as designated public places
- 8. Red Cross Vanuatu
  - a. Has agreed to support evacuee registration to better support the collection of disaggregated data
- 9. Health Cluster/Family Health
  - a. Hygiene promotion through mobile clinic and health outreach teams

Partners on the ground which includes Police, Council representatives and chiefs continue to work closely with the EOC.

The above staff members are now based in Maewo for a deployment period of 1 month. Intermittently, they will return to Port Vila to update reporting and supplies and then resume activities on Maewo. Main objective is to observe and assess the site and prepare a Water System design for relocation site as well as quick fixes/expansion of water systems for host communities.

#### H. RECOMMENDATIONS

- Ensure that all future response actions by NDMO, Government institutions, Civil Society
  Organizations and other agencies must be coordinated and in consultation with
  CDCs/community chiefs and relevant cluster leads.
- 2. Disaggregated data from registration of IDPs to be shared with clusters including data on existing population.
- 3. Continuous movement of evacuees makes it difficult to accurately determine the exact specifics of support requiring detailed household's information.
- 4. Strengthened monitoring of evacuee movement is needed at the National EOC and information shared with relevant clusters.
- 5. WASH assessment of transit schools as well as health care facilities.
- 6. Additional VIP supplies to be obtained to increase production rate.
- 7. Relocation of evacuees from Santo to Maewo may occur, which will require reevaluation of WASH interventions and supplies. Continued monitoring of the situation is needed.

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## **Education Cluster Situation Report**

#### Situation overview

- As a result of the volcanic activity on Ambae and the decision to evacuate all residents, around 2,600 evacuees arrived in Maewo. The Education Cluster registered around 300 children of play group and ECCE age and 550 children of primary age in Maewo. It is estimated that 350 children of ECCE age and 1,650 children of primary age arrived in Santo, which has to be confirmed by an assessment/registration exercise similar to the one implemented in Maewo.
- Due to the limited number of ECCE (17) and primary schools (7) in host communities in Maewo, the existing schools are not be able to accommodate all children relocated from Ambae.
- Schools are currently closed, but will reopen coming Monday, 27. August 2018.

#### **Education Cluster response**

- Based on its assessment findings, the Education Cluster completed its planning for the establishment of ECCE and primary schools of Ambae relocated to Maewo.
- The location for the establishment of 19 Temporary Learning Spaces (TLSs) in 10 communities have been identified in close collaboration with local communities and chiefs.
- This week, a total of five UNICEF supplies Temporary Learning Spaces have been set up with the help of the Vanuatu Mobile Force (VMF) in the communities of Naumumu, Marino, Naone, Talise and Beterara.
- The Education Cluster has worked with chiefs of Maewo to identify trees to be cut down to be sawmilled into furniture's and these has commenced on Tuesday. The aim is to locally source tables and benches for all Temporary Learning Spaces by school re-opening on Monday.
- The MoET has contacted teachers, whose school communities are in Maewo and who are currently not on the island, to travel to Maewo for the school reopening. The Education Cluster expects the availability of sufficient teachers for multi-class/multi-subject teaching.
- Save the Children will provide its seven Child Friendly Spaced (CFS) as ECCE/kindergartens after the reopening of school on Monday.
- The Education Cluster is closely collaborating with the WASH Cluster on the provision of adequate and safe WASH facilities for all Temporary Learning Spaces.

### **Outstanding needs**

• The Education Cluster is waiting for a shipment of additional supplies from Villa including 12 tents, school, recreation and kindy supplies. These supplies are urgently needed for the reopening of schools on Monday.

#### **Constraints**

- The Education Cluster was only able to set up six TLS as a result of the delay of shipment of additional supplies from Port Vila.
- Cash is required for the compensation of trees cut down and the labor involved.
- Transport opportunities are limited and as well as fuel for transport and chainsaw.
- Due to the rainy weather, road access to central Maewo (Ngota) was not possible this week.
