Situation Overview

COVID 19

The National Disaster Management Office takes lead on the overall coordination of the COVID19 operation while the Health Cluster leads the medical aspects of the operation.

State of Emergency is currently on-going with directives pertaining the SoE regulations and the latest Council of Ministers (COM) decision on the Stimulus package.

The COVID-19 response is currently at scenario 21.

Tanna Ash fall

The Tanna Yasur Volcano is currently in Alert Level 2 according to Vanuatu Meteorological and Geo-Hazards Department (VMGD). An assessment on 31 March 2020 shows high impact on livelihood from the east to the central part of the island. A report on that will be released soon and will determine if a response is required.

TC Harold

VMGD Information 01, indicated that Tropical Cyclone Harold Category 1 has moved into Vanuatu's area of responsibility as at 11am, 03 April 2020. It positioned at 195KM southeast of Honiara and is moving in an east south-easterly direction. The potential for the cyclone to intensify and move into Vanuatu in the next 24-48hrs is high.

Teouma Flooding

The heavy rainfall throughout the last weekend has caused flooding and impacted the livelihood of people around Teouma Valley. The area has been assessed and a report will be produced for further response if necessary.

Highlights

- No confirmed cases in Vanuatu. One (1) suspect case in isolation (for more information: covid19.gov.vu)
- The COVID-19 isolation facilities construction in Vila Central and Northern Provincial Hospital are completed. Each isolation facility can hold up to a maximum of 16 people.
- The Finance team has procured 131 bed frames, including mattresses, pillows and other beddings to resource the isolation facility.
- 61 people are still in quarantine at the Holiday Inn resort and are scheduled to be released sometimes this weekend.
- Whilst NDMO is coordinating the COVID-19 response operation, there other natural hazards that are impeding. This includes potential cyclone, flooding and Tanna ash fall.

General Coordination

- The NEOC to coordinate this COVID19 operation with respective sectors and Provincial disaster officers.
- Provincial Emergency Operation Centers (PEOC) throughout Vanuatu are working together with Health working groups at the provincial level to carry out awareness on hand-washing and social distancing.
- All ports of entry in Vanuatu for both land and sea were suspended as at 26 March 2020. Inter-island shipping is currently limited to cargo transfers only while domestic flights are postponed but will be allowed on a case by case basis.
- The Logistics cluster is working with Joint Police Operations Centre (JPOC) to ensure all instructions outlined in the advisories and SoE regulation measures are adhered to.
- As at 28 March 2020, an Advisory Team consisting of Senior Government Officials from designated Departments joined the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) to assist the NDMO in implementing prevention and containment measures to respond to the COVID-19 crisis in the region and Vanuatu.
- Partners provided surge support to NEOC in terms of logistics, public information and overall coordination.
- All schools around Vanuatu were advised to be closed and work on home school package. The Ministry
 of Education (MoET) and Office of the Government Chief Information Officer (OGCIO) are currently
 working on an online learning platform for ease of learning opportunity at home.
- According to COM decision 16 of 2020, decision 12 (vi), school tuition fees are capped to a maximum 42,000VT per annum. This means parents still have to pay tuition fees at least 14,000VT per term to reach a maximum of 42,000VT per annum as per COM's decision.
- Any COVID-19 related information has to be approved by NDMO and health cluster prior to it being published. The Office of the Government Chief Information Officer(OGCIO) will ensure this is implemented
- The public is advised to adhere to curfews as regulated in the State of Emergency Order no. 41 of 2020.




