Situation Overview

The National Disaster Management Office has received all sectoral assessment reports and response plans for both TC Hola and Ambae Volcanic Activity and has compiled a consolidated Response Plan for both hazards for the DCO and COM's to review.

The Ambae Volcano alert level remains in Level 3. It has severely damaged the Southern and Northern parts of the island. Inland parts of the Eastern side of the island are also starting to experience ash fall.

Heavy rainfall and ash fall in the past few days has resulted in landslides and roadblocks. Waluiweibue Village in North Ambae has been washed out by flash-flooding and approximately 116 displaced people were evacuated to a nearby village. South Pentecost has also reported that flash-flooding has caused major damaged to some gardens.

As of this week, due to wind directions, East Ambae and nearby islands Maewo (East, West & South West) and Pentecost are also experiencing heavy ash fall similar that which was experienced in North and South Ambae. Flights to East Ambae are cancelled.

General Coordination

National Coordination

The National Disaster Management Office has received all sectoral assessment reports and response plans for both TC Hola and Ambae Volcanic Activity and has compiled a consolidated Response Plan for both hazards for the DCO and COM's to review.

A Shelter Cluster technical team will be deployed later this week to the TC Hola prioritized areas for further assessment on damaged houses, schools, government houses, community houses and other buildings.

Another team from the Civil Registry will be travelling to Ambae later this week to work on the registration of the displaced population. However, flights to Longana Ambae are still cancelled due to heavy ash fall in the East of Ambae.

Two shipments of relief supplies, including ration, water and non-food items were dispatched since last week to Malekula, Ambrym, Malo, Ambae and Pentecost. The National Disaster Management Office is working closely with the Provincial Disaster Officers of Sanma, Malampa and Penama to coordinate the distribution of the relief supplies. Provincial Coordination

Further on the response, Sanma, Malampa and Penama provincial teams on-ground are currently coordinating the distribution of relief supplies to identified affected communities

Penama

The Penama PDCCC has made distributions to the South and West of Ambae. The rations they have distributed will last for one at least one month. The remaining rations will be distributed to the Northern parts of the island. However, due to road blockages, the PDCCC is still working on clearing the main road to allow transportation for distribution. Flights to Longana are cancelled.

Given that the ash fall has now affected all of Ambae, the priority needs for the whole of Ambae at the moment are:

- 1. Food
- 2. Water
- 3. Shelter
- 4. Health care
- 5. Education (Students welfare)
- 6. Access to North Ambae communities (in great need for food and water)
- 7. Family welfare (Gender & Protection)

Other recommendations

- 8. PWD to assist in clearing road blockages to North Ambae
- 9. Consider sea transportation for food distribution and/or displaced people
- 10. On-going on-island relocation to East, S.East and West Ambae
- 11. Penama PEOC to conduct community assessment and awareness on relocation options
- 12. NDMO to support PEOC on management of Evacuation Centers
